Eligibility criteria: Advanced and Intermediate Pilots. Novice pilots may attend and fly under the supervision of an instructor when conditions allow however they are not permitted to enter the Sport or Open Class Competitions

The 2023 NZ Hang Gliding Open Championships are a NZHGPA sanctioned competition and as such is covered by the following association insurance polices:

ENTRY FEE AND SERVICES PROVIDED

Entry Fee

Comp Pilots:

\$200 NZD if paid prior to 31st Dec 2022, \$220 there after.



LOCAL REGULATIONS

Free Flying Pilots:

Pilots who wish to free fly will be asked to pay \$25 each day they fly with maximum cost being the competition fee.

This fee does **not** come with the benefits of the full comp fee:

- does not include meals
- does not include t-shirt
- Pilots will not be eligible for spot prizes

HG free flyers may fly under one of two scenarios

- Free Fly without registration
 - Pilots are not scored
 - Pilots will launch before the launch window opens
 - o Pilots will avoid flying on task courseline
 - Pilots will not fly the task
- Free Fly with registration
 - Pilots will be scored the days they fly
 - Pilots may launch with other competition pilots
 - Pilots may fly the task

The competition will be conducted according to the following rules:

- FAI Sporting Code Section 7 Common Rules
- FAI Sporting Code Section 7A Hang Gliding and Paragliding Cross Country Championship Rules
- FAI Sporting Code Section 7F Scoring Rules
- Local Rules 44th New Zealand Hang Gliding Open Championship

SCORING

Scoring formula:

As per FAI Sporting Code, Section 7F - XC Scoring 1st May 2021

Gap 2020 scoring programme will be used with the same settings as the <u>2022</u> Nationals. The key parameters are as follows:

Min distance - 5km
Nominal distance - 50km
Nominal time - 1.5 hours
Nominal goal - 10%
Nominal launch - 90%

COMPLAINTS AND PROTESTS

As per FAI Sporting Code Section 7 and 7A. Any complaint or protest should be raised with the Competition Director in the first instance and followed up in writing within 12 hours of the incident taking place, if the matter remains unresolved and needs to be heard by a complaints committee. If required, a complaints committee will be formed by the Meet Director and 3 other senior pilots not directly affected or part of the complaint.

Any complaint on the final day of competition shall be submitted in writing to the Meet Director no later than 1900 hours. Any such complaint will be reviewed and decided upon by the complaints committee prior to the prize giving ceremony.

ORDERED LAUNCH

Should an ordered launch be deemed necessary the order shall be arranged as follows:

• If the ordered launch is on the first flown task of the competition then the order will be the top 10 pilots from the overall results of the 2021 Nationals reversed, followed by the remainder of pilots according to their overall result in the 2021 Nationals.



LOCAL REGULATIONS

- If an ordered launch is required on any other day of the competition then the order will be
 the top 10 placed pilots from the overall results of the tasks flown to date in the current
 Nationals, reversed, followed by the remainder of pilots according to their overall result
 at that point in the current Nationals.
- Pilots not in the top 10 may wish to take one of 5 early bird slots, with the opportunity to launch anytime prior to the main launch window is open. Any pilot wishing to take an early bird slot is required to make this known to the Meet Director within the stipulated time frames given at the briefing. Names will be drawn from a hat if there are more than 5 pilots wanting to take an early bird slot.
- Any early bird pilot who is unable to launch before the main launch window opens is permitted to return to their original launch order.

PILOT SAFETY

At all times Pilots are to remember they are the Pilot in Command of their glider and are to take all steps to keep themselves and others safe at all times. If the air any pilot is flying is beyond their capabilities then they should fly away from this air into more friendly conditions. If the unsettling conditions persist and the pilots fears for their safety they should consider abandoning the task and landing.

Individual pilots in the air can not cancel or stop the task, however they should land if they feel the conditions are unsafe, taking note of the circumstances and concerns and pass these on to the Meet Director.

CANCELLED AND STOPPED TASKS

The Meet Director may only Cancel a task if no pilot has yet launched. Once at least one pilot has launched the Meet Director can only Stop the Task. The rules for how a task is stopped, and then scored are as per 12.3 in FAI Sporting Code, Section 7F XC Scoring.

Once the Meet Director Stops the task he is to note the time at which this decision is made, then inform pilots via their drivers and radio channels. All pilots receiving the stopped task message should unzip their harness (if safe to do so) and dangle their legs from side to side to alert other pilots in their vicinity that the task has been stopped, and then land in a place that is safe to do so.

CHANGED TASK

If a task is changed then ample time must be given to allow pilots to rig in time for the new launch window open time. This is especially important if there is only one start gate making the task a 'race to goal'.



LOCAL REGULATIONS

Tasks are only to be set in areas where the 6000ft forecasted wind strength is between 0-30km/hr. On days where the forecast winds exceed this limit no task is to be set.
